My Dear Hubbie,

It was good to have so many letters from you, but hope you are still getting along o.k. of course we are all praying with you - The minister used you as a good example in his sermon yesterday - It wasn't hard for us to detect who he was talking about. We thank God that he has taken such good care of you so far and I'm sure he will continue -

We thought it was rather comical about you making pancakes and I guess it was worth something you could talk with the civilians - How do you like your Sgts and officers - hope they treat you decent, I bet you are well liked -

I had two letters from ^{Russell} ~~you~~ today. Sorry to say but his foot isn't get along so well he asked that I pray for him

and I sure won't let him down
in that - He is in Cherbourg
and expects he will be sent to
England soon.

I sent you two 8oz packages
today - I hope you will get them
not too far hence - they are going
1st class mail. One package had
a razor and blades, another, tooth
brush and paste, I also had some
life savers in there, but had to
take them out as the package was
a $\frac{1}{2}$ oz too heavy. But I didn't have
too much trouble one of the fellows
at the P.O. helped me wrap it up.

Tonight Bob and I have spent
the night - just writing letters and
keeping Mr. Doxton entertained -
I guess.

I enjoyed seeing Honey over the
week end. I think she will
be there till next week.

I now have a ride home on Sat
with Mr. Charles Conrad, I could
also ride back with him on Monday
mornings - but it is a little

I came back last night.

So you said to tell Grace
hello. I guess that means you
were in Germany, or will be
even though you had a voice
at the top. Sounds like you
will soon have Germany. Takes
care of at the rate you are
going. We hope so -

Hubbie, I still have to write
to Russell - So think I'll
turn this one off for a while
Hope I get around to writing
you again this week. Surely
by now you will have received some
mail - Kenner had gotten some
18 Feb. your last letter was
dated 16 Dec so maybe you will
have some by now -
